Possessive Pronouns

pi = his, hers, theirs, its -nasal form, prefixed before words that begin with a consonant.

pim = his, hers, theirs, its -m form, prefixed before words that begin with a vowel.

Pim awashoha yvt vlhkama.

Our playground is closed.

Pim vlpishi achefa li tuk.

I washed our pillows.

Word Meaning:

pim (pim) = our **awashoha** (ah-wa-sho-ha) = playground

yvt (yaht) = subject marker **achefa** (ah-che-fa) = to wash

li (le) = I **vlhkama** (ahlh-ka-ma) = closed

tuk (tuk) = past tense **vlpishi** (ahlh-pi-shi) = pillow
