

# Lesson of The Day

Vocabulary: ibai impa

**Akaka mvt chim ofi ibai impa.**

That chicken is eating with your dog.

**William ibai impa li tuk.**

I ate with William.

Word Meaning: **akaka** (ah-kahn-kah) = chicken  
**mvt** (maht) = that/those **chim** (chehm) = your  
**ofi** (o-fih) = dog **impa** (ehm-pah) = to eat  
**tuk** (tohk) = past tense marker **li** (lih) = I  
**iba** (ih-bah) or **ibai** (ih-beye) = to be with; together with

**iba** is used before a verb beginning with a **consonant**.

**ibai** is used before a verb beginning with a **vowel**.

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
