Possessive Pronoun: ᵁm - my

This week's lessons will focus on the –m (ᵁm – my) form of possessive pronouns. Last week, we studied and practiced the use of the –n form (n – my) or nasalized form. The –m form is prefixed before words that begin with vowels.

ᵁm aboha yvt libesha.

My room is warm.

ᵁm illimpa yvt kapassa.

My food is cold.

Word Meaning: ᵁm (ahm) = my

aboha (a-bo-ha) = room

illimpa (il-lim-pa) = food

yvt (yaht) = subject marker

libesha (li-be-sha) = warm

kapassa (ka-pas-sa) = cold
