Vocabulary: **haklo** – to listen

Haklo! Hattak mvt kanima il ia chi ka pim anoli.

Listen! That man is telling us where we will go.

Candy vt haklo hosh binili.

Candy is sitting there listening.

Word Meaning:

haklo (hahk-loh) = listen

pim (pihm) = us

hattak (haht-tahk) = man

anoli (ah-noh-lih) = tell

mvt (maht) = that/those

vt (aht) = subject marker

kanima (kah-nih-mah) = where

il (il) = we

hosh (hohsh) = adverb marker

ia (e-yah) = go-going

binili (bih-nih-lih) = sit

chi (chehn) = future tense marker

ka (kahn) = conjunction that connects dependant clause to main clause (usually means “that”)
