Verb: lʌchali – wet/wetting

Chi nushkobo ish lʌchali ho?

Are you wetting your head?

Sʌ nushkobo lʌchali li.

I am wetting my head.

Word Meaning:

chi (che) = your **ish** (esh) = you **li** (le) = I

nushkobo (nosh-ko-boh) = head **sʌ** (sah) = my

lʌchali (la-cha-le) = wet/wetting

ho (hoh) = question marker
